PREREQUISITES	<p>For the academic year 2020-21, German Language Courses are offered to the Students of the Department of Geography of Harokopio University at the following levels:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A1+ • Level A2 • Level B1 <p>LEVEL A1+ The course is suitable for students who have knowledge of the German language at A1 level and have already been taught the German language (at least) for one year at school.</p> <p>LEVEL A2 Prerequisite for this Level, is the knowledge of the German language at a level equal to / or higher than A1 which is proven by a certificate of language proficiency A1. In case the Students are not holders of a degree they are going to participate in qualifying exams.</p> <p>LEVEL B1 Prerequisite for this Level, is the knowledge of the German language at a level equal to / or higher than A2 which is proven by a certificate of language proficiency A2 or B1. In case the Students are not holders of a degree they are going to participate in qualifying exams.</p> <p>Please note the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students with no previous knowledge of the German language can not join a German Language Level. ○ For the final classification of Students in a German language department, their participation in qualifying exams may be necessary. ○ All language groups will be formulated by the Instructors ○ The choice of the foreign language by the student remains the same for both semesters
